

Juerg B. WinterDr sc. Techn, Dipl. Ing. ETHZ, M.B.A. (INSEAD)

Dr. Winter was born in Geneva in 1944. After his "Maturité" at the College Calvin he graduated in 1968 as a Mechanical Engineer with specialization in industrial management at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology in Zurich.

After two years of extensive travel, he founded, together with an associate, WINTER PARTNERS, a consulting company dedicated to automation processes in the financial services industry. In 1973 he published his doctoral thesis on automation of the securities processing in financial institutions at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology. Under his guidance WINTER PARTNERS entered the core banking software solution development and implementation fields and became by the end of the 1980s a leading supplier with over 200 customers and offices in the main financial centers (London, New York, Singapore, Hong Kong).

In 1992, Dr. Winter sold his shares in WINTER PARTNERS and bought the starting risk management business of WINTER PARTNERS to bring it into IRIS integrated risk management ag, a new company he started with Dr. Willi Brammertz. The mission of IRIS was and still is to develop, implement and maintain a standard single unified financial analysis infrastructure for the benefits of financial services providers and the overall financial transparency. This resulted in the development of the riskpro™ unified financial analysis infrastructure, which the company develops continuously and is used today by over 200 small to large institutions in 16 countries.

Dr. Winter is today CEO and President of IRIS integrated risk management ag group of companies.

He is also a board member of the Geneva-based [Forum Finance Group S.A.](#), an asset management firm focused on growth and high tech investments.

Dr. Winter is a former chairperson and honorary member of the Swiss Informatics Society and a former member of the Board of the European Computer Services Association.

Since 1970 Dr. Winter has published various articles on banking organization, financial information technology, unified financial analysis and risk management.
